PASSES

Passes can be purchased directly off of our website (www.pasadenafilmfestival.org) or at Will Call at the Laemmle Playhouse 7 Movie Theater located at 673 E Colorado Blvd, Pasadena, CA 91101. It is only \$130 for an "All-Access Pass" (less than \$2 per film), \$80 for a "Screener/Lounge" Pass (includes all events except the Gala), \$50 for a "Gala Pass" and \$30 for a "Day Pass". If you would like to attend the Great Gatsby Gala/ Award Ceremony, or our Filmmakers Lounge, a pass is required for admission. If purchasing a day pass, please email info@pasadenafilmfestival.org to let us know which day you would like to attend. PASSES ARE NOT MAILED, BUT CAN BE PICKED UP AT WILL CALL AT THE START OF THE FESTIVAL. Please be sure to show picture I.D. when picking up your pass. You will also need to show ID for admittance to the Filmmakers Lounge. Alcohol will be available, so only 21 and over, please at the Filmmakers Lounge and the Great Gatsby Gala. All ages are allowed at our screenings at the Laemmle, but be advised that other than our "Family Friendly Fair" Block, our program is designed for adults.






